81% of you responded that you were very or fairly satisfied with the practice opening times.

On the 1st October a new extended access service started for patients of Hampton Surgery. This is based at Blossomfield Surgery, Blossomfield Road, Solihull. The service is provided collectively by the practices within south Solihull. When using this service you will be seen by a clinician within this group of practices and not necessarily a member of the Hampton Team.

The practice has recently seen a steady increase in the number of appointments that patient are not turning up for. Missed appointments not only cost the practice time and money it also means that another patient is missing out on the opportunity to see a clinician. If you cannot attend your appointment please call the surgery in plenty of time so that someone else can use it

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The practice is a training practice and has qualified doctors (GP Registrars & F2 Doctors) undertaking further training based at the surgery to gain experience in general practice under the supervision of Dr Rodger Charlton, Dr Ryan Prince and Dr Rosemary Smith who are all qualified GP trainers.

A Foundation Year 2 Doctor (F2) is a fully registered Doctor in their second year after finishing medical School. They are at the surgery for a period of four months to gain experience in general practice.

A GP registrar is a doctor who has completed their medical training and is now specialising in becoming a GP. They will be working towards their specialised exams as set by the Royal College of GPs (MRCGP) a qualification all GP Registrars must pass before they can go on to be a GP. They can be with the practice for either 6 or 12 months.

All the registrars/F2 doctors who are with the surgery work under the direct supervision of the GP trainers. They can any time call upon the trainer for assistance and advice, and each day the consultations you have had with the registrar/F2 doctor can be discussed after the clinic to ensure the best possible outcome for the patient involved.

The benefit of being a training practice allows us to provide the good access to appointments that the surgery offers, though this can sometimes mean a long wait to see one of the Senior Doctors.

Times are changing

Evening (6.30-8pm), weekend (Sat and Sun 8-11am) appointments available for patients at this practice from October.

This extended service will operate from Blossomfield Surgery Hub, and there will be GP, nurse or healthcare assistants appointments available.
