

REMEMBER TO GET YOUR INFLUENZA VACCINE

Influenza vaccines for both adults and children are still available – if you fall into one of the categories below and have not yet been vaccinated please call the surgery on 01675 442510 to book an appointment for your vaccination

Changes to repeat prescriptions in Solihull

Requests for repeat prescriptions have changed. From Friday 1 September patients who used to have their medicines ordered on their behalf by their pharmacists or online pharmacies, will now need to order it directly from their GP surgery. This change helps GPs to monitor medicines prescribed to patients and aims to reduce the amount of wasted medicines.

Thank you to everyone who completed the practice survey over the summer. The survey helped us recruit 3 new patients to the Patient Participation Group and as detailed below showed that you thought we were performing well in many areas.
